

KISS ME I'M ARF-ISH

This light, bright, minty kiss of a treat bursts with breath-freshening flavors from the herb garden to sweeten up St. Patrick's Day smooches (whether you're Irish, Arf-ish, or something else). Sometimes, it's easy being green.

INGREDIENTS & MATERIALS

- 3 4 sprigs of fresh parsley (finely chopped)
- 2 3 basil leaves (finely chopped)
- 2 3 mint leaves (finely chopped)
- 4 Tbsp Plain Yogurt
- 1 Tbsp Coconut Oil
- 1/2 C raw dog food or meat blend
- 3 4 dehydrated pears (sugar-free)
- Silicone ice cube mold
- Large or small Toppl[®]

DIRECTIONS

- Harvest your herb garden (or raid your fridge for leftover snips like we did.)
- 2. Mix 4 tablespoons of plain yogurt with 1 tablespoon of coconut oil in a small bowl.
- 3. Fill molds with yogurt-coconut mixture and put in the freezer for about 30 minutes.
- 4. Fill the Toppl with raw meat blend, then add the frozen molds.
- 5. Top with slices of dehydrated pears.
- 6. Serve with a Guinness (for you, obvs.)

INGREDIENTS & MATERIALS

- 2 Quail eggs* or one hard-boiled chicken egg
- 2 small carrots
- 1 rabbit ear
- 1/4 C frozen rabbit patties
- 1/4 C pumpkin puree
- Large or small Tux[®]

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Place the eggs in Tux and fill the rest with rabbit meat.
- 2. Add the rabbit ears, pumpkin puree and carrots.
- 3. Put in the freezer for an hour or two, and serve for Easter brunch.
- O Tag us @WestPawUS.

Quail eggs can often be found in the frozen pet food section at your local pet store. Raw or cooked works; however you or your pet prefer! If you don't have quail eggs, part of a hard-boiled chicken egg will do just fine.



Tux is made for the toughest chewers—so when this Easter Bunny Basket is fully devoured, there's still something safe to grind on. That's good, because chewing can relieve boredom, neutralize anxiety, and keep jaws strong.

CANADIAN BACON CAMPFIRE CUP

Is that a tiny campfire in a cup?! It is indeed, and it practically crackles with smoky bacon logs, toasty sweet potato and carrot flames, and crunchy kibble embers. Serve this one under the stars. (Or in the living room at lunch, dogs will still be stoked.)

INGREDIENTS & MATERIALS

- 2-5 pieces of Crumps Natural Sweet Potato Chews (these are sliced, dehydrated pieces of sweet potato with a leathery texture for chewing)
- 2-3 slices of Carrot
- 1 Canadian Bacon Treats from Farm Fresh Pet Foods
- 1 Small cookie treat
- 1/2 C Kibble
- 1 tsp Peanut Butter and Banana Creamy Treat from West Paw*
- 1/4 C Grass-Fed Beef Gently Cooked Recipe from Open Farm
- Large or small Toppl[®]

*Look for natural brands without xylitol, which is toxic to dogs.

DIRECTIONS

- 1. First, fill the side hole in the Toppl[®] with peanut butter and your choice of small cookie treat. Freeze to seal.
- 2. Remove Toppl from the freezer and fill halfway with kibble. (If you feed raw, swap in dehydrated treats instead.)
- 3. Fill up the rest of the Toppl to the rim with wet or raw food.
- 4. Let's get this fire started! Arrange the sweet potato chews on top to look like flames, pushing them into the wet food for stability.
- 5. Cut the carrots into small triangles. Arrange them in front of each piece of sweet potato.
- 6. Place kibble around the edge of the Toppl to mimic embers.
- 7. Cut the smoky bacon stick treats into 4 pieces, popping them in to look like logs poking up out of the flames.
- 8. Feed fresh or frozen, with s'mores for the chef.

Toppl's our top pick for newbie puzzlers—and chefs! The wide-open end makes it easy for chefs to put food in AND for dogs to get it out, but it still slows taste-testers down just enough for a fun challenge.





RED, WHITE, & BLUEBERRY

In our Declaration of Decadence, we hold these truths to be self-evident: that all dogs deserve this yummy summer number, and that it tastes just as good on regular days as holidays. Chill sweet fruit, tangy yogurt, and savory meat treats into one cool firecracker of a feast.

INGREDIENTS & MATERIALS

- 15 Freeze-Dried Raw Beef Heart Treats from West Paw
- 15 pieces of PureBites Freeze-Dried Cheddar Cheese
- 5 Tbsp Plain yogurt
- 3 Blueberries
- 1/2 Red bell pepper
- 1 slice of Dragonfruit or kiwi (without the skin)
- Star-shaped cookie cutter or ice cube mold
- Large or small Tux[®]

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Stuff Tux full of freeze-dried cheese and West Paw Beef Heart Freeze-Dried Raw Treat.
- 2. Use a spoon to cover the treats with yogurt.
- 3. Take 3 blueberries and place them in the yogurt (or 4, it's a free country).

- 7. Serve frozen to cool off your pup and slow their snarf.

Here's how to soothe firework anxiety: start by giving dogs a puzzle treat while playing a recording of fireworks softly in the background, months before firework season. - 15 Freeze-dried cheddar cheese
- 1/2 Orange bell pepper
- 8 Blueberries
- Large or small Rumbl[®]

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Plug the side hole in the Rumbl with a West Paw Beef Heart Freeze-Dried Treat.
- 2. Fill Rumbl with freeze-dried cheddar cheese and West Paw Beef Heart Freeze-Dried Treat. If your dog is dairy-free or on a diet, swap the cheese for kibble.

- 1 slice Pineapple
- 1 Mango
- 2 strips Canine Country Chews Duck jerky
- 3 Small Fruitables cookie treats
- 1/4 C Plain unsweetened yogurt
- Large or small Qwizl[®]

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Peel and core pineapple, then slice into thin strips.
- 2. Slice duck jerky into thin strips.
- 3. Stuff the pineapple and jerky into the ends of the Qwizl.
- 4. Peel mango and cut two small strips. Stuff into the slots in the Qwizl.

MEAT LOVER'S PUMPKIN PIE


Nothing says "grateful" like pumpkin pie, but you know what dogs are thinking: "where's the beef?" Pair fall's classic dessert with a lively, liver-y beefy kick, and you've basically checked off a dog's whole gratitude journal.


INGREDIENTS & MATERIALS

- 1/2 C 100% pure canned pumpkin
- 1/3 C Cream cheese (we used dairy-free cream cheese)
- 1/4 Tbsp Cinnamon
- Pinch of Ginger
 1 Tbsp Beef Liver and Pumpkin Creamy Treat from West Paw
- Large or small Tux[®]

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Schmear West Paw Beef Liver and Pumpkin Creamy Treat to the bottom of the Tux.
- 2. Mix canned pumpkin, cream cheese, cinnamon, and ginger together until combined.



- 1 tsp Pepitas (aka pumpkin seed)
- A pinch of Flax seed
- 1/2 C Non-Fat Greek Yogurt
- Ghost Ice Cube Mold
- Large or small Toppl[®]



DIRECTIONS

- 1. Cook oats according to instructions. Once fully cooked, mix in a drizzle of honey and a dash of cinnamon. Then, spoon into Toppl.
- 2. Top with unsweetened dried cranberries, pepitas, flax seed, and a few spirits from your spooky Halloween ice cube mold.

- Water bottle ice cube tray
- Large or small Qwizl[®]

DIRECTIONS

Speed prep

1. No ice cube tray? No problem. Add the shredded chicken and chopped veggies into the Qwizl on their own.

Freezer prep

- 1. Shred cooked chicken into small pieces and distribute across a narrow ice cube tray.
- 2. Add in a layer of cooked quinoa, chopped carrots and celery. (Meh on celery? Some dogs love peas instead.)
- 3. Fill each mold with bone broth until all ingredients are covered. Freeze for at least 1 hour.
- 4. Once frozen, release molds from the tray and add to the Qwizl.


INGREDIENTS & MATERIALS

- 1 tsp Dog-Safe green ingredients of your choice (e.g. Broccoli, parsley, mint, green bean)
- 1 tsp Dog-Safe red ingredients (i.e. raspberries, apple, strawberry, cranberry)
- Large or small Tux[®]

DIRECTIONS


- 1. Place the quail egg or egg portion into the Tux first.

CANINE CANDY CANE


In 1670, a German choirmaster invented the first candy canes. Why? The "sugar sticks" shushed kiddos during church sermons. Keep your "kids" out of trouble in the sweetest way possible too—with healthy fruit, probiotic-rich yogurt, and no added sugar.

INGREDIENTS & MATERIALS

- Fresh Raspberries and/or strawberry (crushed). 3-4 raspberries per mold.
- Plain Greek Yogurt (1 Tbsp of plain greek yogurt per water bottle ice cube tray mold, depending on size)
- Water bottle ice cube tray
- Large or small Qwizl[®]

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Mash your fruit of choice and set aside.
- 2. Fill your water bottle ice cube tray first with mashed berries, using your fingers to create space an even space in between the berries. Use a dry paper towel to absorb any juice from the empty paces to ensure the red color won't bleed into the white yogurt later. Freeze.
- 3. Remove your tray from the freezer and begin filling the gaps with the plain greek yogurt this two-step method keeps the colors from running together. Place the tray back into the freezer for a minimum of 3 hours.
- 4. Remove from freezer and run the thin ice cube under tap water for a second to make it easier to slide into the Qwizl.
- 5. Place inside the Qwizl and serve—right before you get on that family Zoom.



CANINE BRAIN TIP

Qwizl encourages dogs to keep chewing on the problem because the "windows" let them see, smell, taste, and hold the reward without wolfing it down all at once. And that makes the eventual victory even sweeter.





SANTA CLAWS' MILK & COOKIES

Christmas comes but once a year, but *ahem* your dog delivers joy every day. What about saying thanks with a canine midnight snack? Turn any dog's day into Christmas with this festive mini-feast. Why not? They're on the "nice" list—and this treat-toy distraction will keep them off the "naughty" one.

INGREDIENTS & MATERIALS

- Portion of your dog's meal (could be kibble* or raw) I utilized approximately 2/3 C of raw food total
- 3 Tbsp Plain yogurt or Open Farm Kefir
- 2-3 Fresh Mint or Parsley leaves
- 3 Fresh or Dried cranberries
- 3-4 Tbsp Chopped Cooked Chicken or Turkey
- Sprinkle Cinnamon
- Dog Cookie of Choice
- Large or small Toppl[®]

If using kibble, we recommend using some onion-free bone broth to help freeze your creation together. We love Open Farm—they carry Beef, Turkey, and Chicken bone broth variations.

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Plug the side hole of your Toppl with wine cork.
- 2. Place a portion of your dog's meal inside the base of Toppl.
- 3. Add a bit of chopped chicken or turkey, and layer with sprinkle of your dog's meal on top.
- 4. If using kibble, add 1-2 spoons of bone broth onto the kibble, leaving about a small finger-width gap between the contents and the top lip of the Toppl—that's where the "icing" (aka yogurt or kefir) goes.
- 5. Freeze the Toppl for minimum 4 hours.
- 6. With a small spoon or squeeze bottle, slowly fill the remaining top of the Toppl with yogurt or Kefir.
- 7. Sprinkle one small pinch cinnamon into the center.
- 8. Once the Toppl is filled, place a cranberry with two mint leaves (or parsley sprigs) on top for safe mistletoe look.
- 9. Garnish with a dog cookie of choice into the side, resting on the lip.
- 10. If your dog has been EXTRA good, place a Qwizl "Canine Candy
- Cane" in the top, like a festive straw. 11. Place back into the freezer for minimum 4 hours.
- II. Place back into the freezer for minimum 4 hours.
- 12. Remove from freezer (and uncork the side hole!).

- Additional treats of choice of different shapes & sizes. I used 1 Tbsp of Wet Noses Inc, "Little Stars" and 2 dehydrated Beef Liver treats (cut into strips) from Murphy's Treats.
- Large or small Rumbl[®]

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Place the Rumbl upright and fill 'er up with various treats of different shapes, textures, and sizes.
- 2. Tip: Cut big treats in half. The fun part for dogs is coaxing the treats out, but it loses appeal if it's too hard.
- 3. Serve with a champagne toast to your dog (while keeping the Tattinger for the humans, of course.)
