Various types of closures are available for duvet covers and pillowcases although not everyone is familiar with them. Here are some extra descriptions about the various options then:

The tuck-in flap

A tuck in flap - as the name already suggests - is a strip of fabric on your duvet cover that you can use to tuck in your duvet cover. You can tuck it under the mattress, but some people prefer to tuck the flap back into the duvet cover or let it hang down as far as the floor.

Unless otherwise stated, our duvet covers have a double tuck in flap extension measuring 40 cm in length. This means that the duvet cover is actually 40 cm longer than the specified length. Therefore, it is a full-width tuck-in flap (over the entire width). All other sides are fully closed, just the bottom end is open. The double tuck in flap extension is therefore suitable for duvets of various lengths.

The bottleneck

A bottleneck is a variant of the tuck-in flap that you can use to tuck in your duvet cover. The main difference from the double tuck-in flap extension, is that the outer sides of the flap are stitched together and the opening is narrower in the middle, just like a bottleneck. Your duvet stays securely in place inside the cover this way.

By the way, the flap is also double-sided, although it does not run over the entire width, which means it is not so nice to let it hang loose. Our duvet covers with bottleneck openings are 220 or 240 cm in length and the bottleneck closure is always explicitly listed.

The button fastener

A duvet cover with button fasteners does not feature a tuck in flap, instead it has hidden buttons that you use to fasten the bottom end of the duvet cover. This means that the cover is exactly 200 or 220 cm in length and does not hang over the end of your bed.

One advantage of button fasteners is that your duvet stays perfectly in place inside the duvet cover. A duvet cover with button fasteners cannot be tucked in and is therefore ideal if you like to have your duvet lying 'loose' on your bed, or for restless sleepers who like to kick their duvet loose from the lower end of their bed. When it comes to our duvet covers, the ones with button fasteners are always explicitly listed.
