DECORATIVE JARS - BABY FEET



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Preface

There is nothing quite like working on an idea for something homemade and then giving that little something as a present to someone you love. You can use the instructions here to crochet the same project or you can use it as a source of inspiration for your own ideas. A self-crocheted article is absolutely unique and therefore very special.

You will need:

- großes Glas mit Deckel mit Schraubverschluss, 12,7 cm (inkl. Deckel), 9,5 cm Ø

- Häkelnadel Nr 2,5

- Klebepistole oder Alleskleber

- waschbares Füllmaterial

- Baumwollhäkelgarn 50 g Larra Scheepjeswol

Larra colour numbers:

Hautfarbe: 7355

Rosa: 7403 Blau: 7408

Weiß: 7310

If you choose to work with a thicker hook, crochet one or two round less leaving out round 9 and/or 10. The crochet work for the lid should come up a little smaller so that it fits better. Crochet the three rounds (without increases or decreases) for the side edges. In the last round, decrease equally approx. 6 dc.

General tips

When decreasing double crochet stitches (= dc2tog):

Always insert the hook in the front loop of the previous round so the decrease is not so noticeable.

Fastening off:

At the end of the last round do not cut the yarn too short and draw it through the last stitch. Use and fasten off the yarn later to connect the parts.

There are three ways to close a round:

- Close a round with a sl st and begin the next rnd with 1 ch.
- Turn the work over at the end of a round and crochet back in the other direction.
- Mark the beginning of the round in a contrasting colour and continue crocheting in spirals. Note: The closing method affects the total number of rounds. That's why it's always important to follow the instructions.

<u>Important:</u> If a sl st is crocheted in a rnd, this is counted just like other stitches. Exception: If a rnd is closed with a sl st, then this sl st is not counted as a stitch.

Lid cover: In white: Close rnd with 1 sl st

1: 6 dc into ring,

2: 1 ch - 6x 1 dc inc [12 st]

3: 1 ch - 6x (1 dc - 1 dc inc) [18 st]

4: 1 ch - 6x (2 dc - 1 dc inc) [24 st]

5: 1 ch - 6x (3 dc - 1 dc inc) [30 st]

6: 1 ch - 6x (4 dc - 1 dc inc) [36 st]

7: 1 ch - 6x (5 dc - 1 dc inc) [42 st]

8: 1 ch - 6x (6 dc - 1 dc inc) [48 st]

9: 1 ch - 6x (7 dc - 1 dc inc) [54 st]

10: 1 ch - 6x (8 dc - 1 dc inc) [60 st]

11 + 12 + 13 + 14: 1 ch - 60 dc

15: 1 ch - 6x (8 dc - dc2tog) [54 st]

Fasten off.

Feet: In nude Close all rnds with 1 sl st

1: 6 dc into ring secure CC, continue working spiral rounds.

2: 6x 1 dc inc [12 st]

3: 6x (1 dc - 1 dc inc) [18 st]

4: 3 dc - 1 dc inc - 4 dc - 1 dc inc - 4 dc - 1 dc inc - 4 dc [21 st]

5+6+7: 21 dc

From here crochet the left and right foot separately:

Left foot:

8: 2x dc2tog - 7 dc - dc2tog - 6 dc - dc2tog
[17 st]

9: 17 dc

10: 2x 1 dc inc – 15 dc [19 st]

11: 3x 1 dc inc - 8 dc - 1 dc inc - 7 dc [23 st]

12: 3x (1 dc inc – 2 dc) – 6 dc – 1 dc inc – 7 dc [27 st]

13: 19 dc – dc2tog – 6 dc [26 st]

14: 18 dc – dc2tog – 6 dc [25 st]

15: 4 dc – dc2tog – 1 dc – dc2tog – 7 dc – dc-

 $2 \log - 2 dc - dc 2 \log - 3 dc [21 st]$

16: 4 dc - dc2tog - 1 dc - dc2tog - 5 dc - dc-2tog - 1 dc - dc2tog - 2 dc [17 st]

17: 8x dc2tog – 1 dc [9 st]

Stuff. Fasten off. Draw the yarn through the flp of the last 9 st and pull tightly.

Right foot:

8: dc2tog - 6 dc - dc2tog - 7 dc - 2x dc2tog
[17 st]

9: 17 dc

10: 1 dc inc - 15 dc - 1 dc inc [19 st]

11: 1 dc inc - 7 dc - 1 dc inc - 8 dc - 2 dc inc [23 st]

12: 1 dc - 1 dc inc - 7 dc - 1 dc inc - 8 dc - 1 dc inc - 2 dc - 1 dc inc - 1 dc [27 st]

13: 11 dc – dc2tog – 14 dc [26 st]

14: 11 dc – dc2tog – 13 dc [25 st]

15: dc2tog – 7 dc – dc2tog – 2 dc – dc2tog –

7 dc - dc2tog - 1 dc [21 st]

16: dc2tog – 5 dc – dc2tog – 1 dc – dc2tog –

5 dc – dc2tog – 2 dc [17 st]

17: 8x dc2tog – 1 dc [9 st]

Stuff. Fasten off. Draw the yarn through the flp of the last 9 st and pull tightly.

Big toe: In nude: Close all rnds with 1 sl st

1: 6 dc into ring

2: 1 ch - 6x 1 dc inc [12 st]

3: 1 ch - 3x (1 dc inc - 3 dc) [15 st]

4: 1 ch - 15 dc

5: 1 ch - 3x (dc2tog - 3 dc) [12 st]

6: 6x dc2tog [6 st]

Fasten off. Stuff. Draw the yarn through the flp of the last 9 st and pull tightly.

Second toe: In nude: Close all rnds with 1 sl st

1: 6 dc into ring

2: 1 ch – 6x 1 dc inc [12 st]

3: 1 ch - 12 dc

4: 1 ch - 2x (4 dc - dc1tog) [10 st], stuff.

6: 5x dc2tog [5 st]

Fasten off. Draw the yarn through the flp of the last 5 st and pull tightly.

Next two toes: In nude: Close all rnds with 1 sl st

1: 6 dc into ring

2: 1 ch - 2x (2 dc inc - 1 dc) [10 st]

3: 1 ch - 10 dc

4: 1 ch - 2x dc2tog - 1 dc - 2x dc2tog - 1 dc [6 st]

Fasten off. Stuff. Draw the yarn through the flp of the last 9 st and pull tightly.

Little toe: In nude: Close all rnds with 1 sl st

1: 6 dc into ring

2: 1 ch - 2x (1 dc inc - 2 dc) [8 st]

3: 1 ch - 2x (dc2tog - 2 dc) [6 st]

Fasten off. Stuff. Draw the yarn through the flp of the last 9 st and pull tightly.

Sew the toes closely together on the front edge of the foot making sure the middle toe is attached in line with rnd 17.

Determine which side is the top and then pull the toes up a little and secure with a stitch.







Sew the feet to the top of the lid cover.







Bow: (middle part)

Turn over at the end of the R

1: 6 ch

2: 1 dc in 2nd ch from hook – 4 dc [5 st]

3-5: 1 ch-5 dc

6: 1 ch - 1 dc - dc2tog - 2 dc [4 st]

7: 1 ch - 4 dc

Bow:

Turn over at the end of the R

1: 6 ch

2: 1 dc in 2nd ch from hook – 4 dc [5 st]

8: 1 ch - 1 dc - dc2tog - 1 dc [3 st]

9 - 17: 1 ch - 3 dc

18: 1 ch - 1 dc - 1 dc inc - 1 dc [4 st]

19: 1 ch - 4 dc

20: 1 ch - 2 dc - 1 dc inc - 1 dc [5 st]

21+22: 1 ch - 5 dc

Fasten off

3 - 23: 1 ch - 5 dc

Fasten off

Join Rs 1 and 23.

Ribbon for jar:

Turn over at the end of the R

1: 5 ch

2: 1 dc in 2nd ch from hook - 3 dc

3 - 59: 1 ch - 4 dc

Check the length. Add a few more rows if necessary, but make sure that the ribbon does not slip down.

Place the bow around the middle part with the widest ends at the bottom. Sew the bow on and pull it into the desired shape.

Wrap the ribbon for the jar right under the lid. Connect the first and last rows.

Sew the bow over the seam.

Stick the lid cover to the top of the lid starting at the front. Then stick down the top and finally the side edges and the back.
