1. Instructions For Use

■ 1-1. Precautions and Notices

1. Do not place the device under direct sunlight or in extremely cold conditions for an extended period of time,

Direct exposures to extreme temperatures may damage the device. When the device is not in operation, make sure the temperature stays within the storage temperatures. The exterior of the device may change in color when exposed to direct sunlight for a prolonged period of time.

2. Do not disassemble, repair, or modify the device.

Do not attempt to disassemble, modify, or repair the device. Warranty cover will be void if a repair has been attempted by the user or anyone unauthorized.

3. Do not modify and cut the power cable,

Modifying or cutting the power cable can damage the device and the vehicle. We are not responsible for any damages as a result of such modifications.

4. Do not operate the device with wet hands.

Do not expose the device to liquids or humid conditions, When cleaning the device, do not use water, chemicals or liquid detergent to clean the device. Please use a soft and dry cloth.

- 5. Avoid heavy impacts on the device, Doing so may damage the device,
- 6. Do not insert foreign objects into the device, Doing so may damage the device,
- 7. Only use genuine accessories provided by the manufacturer.

We recommend using genuine accessories that are tested safe and compatible with Qvia Dash Cams. We are not responsible for any problems caused by using other accessories not supplied by the manufacturer.

8. We do not guarantee compatibility when using other devices and peripherals from other manufacturers with Qvia Dash Cams.

The user must take full responsibility for any damages as a result of using such devices and peripherals.

9. Do not operate the device when the vehicle ignition is turned off for an extended period of time.

Operating the device for an extended period of time with the ignition off can result in vehicle battery drainage.

10. Image quality might be affected when there are extreme changes in lighting conditions.

The quality of the video can be affected when driving through extremely dark/light areas, (For example, entering and exiting a tunnel or parking garage, too much backlighting, pitch black darkness at night etc.)

- 11. An accident with light impact that is not enough to start Event Recording may not be recorded.
 - Light impact may not be detected for Event Recording depending on the users settings and the level of impact. Also, if high impact disconnects power supply to the device, Event Recording may not be saved,
- 12, Disconnecting the power cable while the device is in operation or using an incorrect input voltage can damage the device or cause fire,
- 13. Some PCs may not support Qvia Viewer or there may be disconnections in audio/video footage depending on the PC's specifications,
- 14. The AE (Automatic Exposure) operation may not function properly if the vehicle's color reflects less light (black, red, etc.)
- 15. The AE operation, and dramatic changes in exposures may result in darker footage and loss of frame rate. The camera angle can also affect the AE operation.
 - If the AE operation does not function properly, please adjust the camera angle.
- 16, Videos recorded in low-light conditions can have noise, and footage may shutter from car shakes when braking,
- 17. There might be loss of data when there is a sudden frame rate drop, or when switching between Parking & Driving Modes,
- Motion Detections can sometimes result in incorrect operation depending on lighting, weather, and other surrounding conditions. In some cases, consecutive motions can be detected.
- Motion Detections may not operate properly due to noises and reflections of Security LED if recording takes places in underground parking lots, and low-light conditions.
- 20. The device is equipped with a wide-angle lens, and the left and right side of video footage may differ in quality.
- 21. Traffic lights may appear to be flickering due the lights' location and signal frequency.
- 22, The camera cannot be connected via Wi-Fi with more than one device at a time, Internet connection is disconnected when your smartphone is connected to the device.
- 23. Some functions of the Qvia App might be unavailable depending on the types of smartphones.
- 24. The range of Wi-Fi may vary depending on data transmission rates and other circumstances,
- 25. If the rear camera is not securely connected, rear videos are not saved on the memory card,
- 26. When in Parking Mode, Time Lapse Recording and Motion Detection Recording cannot be used at the same time.
- 27. It is not recommended to record continuously in Parking Mode.
 - If you wish to record continuously when the vehicle is parked, it is recommended to have an extra battery pack, We are not responsible for the vehicle's battery drainage as a result of continuous recording in Parking Mode without an extra battery pack,
- 28, If you suspect any malfunction of the device, stop using the device and contact your local distributor or Qvia CS center.

■ 1-2. Installation

1. Keep the surrounding of the device clear.

Please ensure the surrounding area is clutter-free. Unnecessary objects on the dashboard can reflect off the windshield and may reduce the audio/video quality.

- 2. Keep the camera lens clean at all times.
- 3. Do not install or operate the device while driving,

For your safety, do not install and/or operate the device while driving, it can cause an accident,

4. Keep the device securely mounted at all times.

The device can fall and be damaged if it is not securely mounted as instructed in this user guide.

- 5. Video footage can be indistinct and/or distorted if the windshield is excessively tinted.
- 6. When installing the device, pick a spot where it does not interfere with GPS reception. (Radio, CD/MP3 players etc.)

■ 1-3. GPS **■**

- A typical GPS receiver achieves an accuracy of 15 meters. There may be conditions where GPS signals cannot be received depending on the driving environments such as tunnels, underpasses, skyscrapers, and street light which affect the accuracy level.
- 2. It may take some time to receive GPS signal for the first time after power is turned on depending on weather and other conditions.
- 3. Excessive tinting and other electronic devices can interfere with GPS signal,
- 4. When the vehicle is at a stop, driving speed may show between the 1~30km/h range depending on the GPS reception status.
- 5. GPS data can be lost if the device is not turned on.
- 6. Time on the device may not be accurate if the device does not have GPS.

■ 1-4. Memory Card

1. Do not remove the memory card while the device is recording.

Make sure you completely turn off the device before removing the memory card, Removing the card when the power is on can damage the card and video files, as well as the device.

2, It is recommended that you format the memory card at least once a month (for a 16GB memory card,)

Since a dash cam continuously writes and deletes files on the memory card, the card and the saved files can be damaged. Formatting your memory card on a regular basis can prevent such damages. Also, a memory card is a consumable item which can only last for about 6 month on average. We are not responsible for any loss of data or recording problems as a result of using a memory card after prolonged use.

3. Only use memory cards supplied by the manufacturer.

We are not responsible for any problems caused as a result of using memory cards from other manufacturers.

4. Handle with care when inserting and removing the memory card to avoid burns,

A memory card operate at very high temperatures. Be careful when handling the card.

- 5. The range of operating temperatures may vary depending on the performance of a memory card,
- 6. Back up videos on the memory card to another storage device (e.g., PC, External Hard Drive) to prevent loss of important data,
- 7. Format your memory card before changing the device's settings.
- 8. No firmware updates or configuration settings is needed after formatting the memory card.

The user's latest settings is saved on the device. So no configuration settings is required after the format is complete.

9. Please format the memory card on the device itself for convenience,

Memory card can be formatted on the device itself. So you do not need to remove the memory card to format it on a PC.

- 10. Make sure you insert a memory card into the device. Without it, the device does not start recording.
- The device has Format-Free function, With this function, malfunctions may occur if unsupported files are copied to, moved or deleted from the memory card.
- 12. When formatting a memory card on a PC, it is recommended that you opt for the full format option rather than the quick format option.

■ 1-5. ADAS (Advanced Driver Assistance System) ■

- 1. ADAS is available only on a GPS-enabled device.
- 2, For Auto Calibration of ADAS, please follow the instructions on page 14,
- 3, LDWS (Lane Departure Warning System) may not function as designed when driving in the rain at night, in the snow and in extreme road conditions.
- Do not relocate the device or adjust the camera lens after Auto Calibration is complete, Doing so requires Auto Calibration again after rebooting the device.
- 5. Go through below steps for Auto Calibration,
 - The device needs to be turned on.
 - Stable GPS signal
 - Drive on a straight road at a speed greater than 30km/h (18mph) for more than 3 minutes,
- 6. Pressing the 'M' button on the bottom of the device will manually initiate Auto Calibration.
- 7. ADAS may not function properly when driving through an area that has weak GPS signal,
- 8. It is recommended that you use ADAS data for reference purposes only. We are not responsible for any road accidents as a result of incorrect operation of ADAS,
- ** The level of accuracy of ADAS data can vary depending on the user's environment, It is recommended that you use the data for reference purposes only.
- * Using a T/S cable from other manufactures does not guarantee the correct operation of the device. The device can also be damaged.
- If you wish to use a T/S cable, it is recommended that you get a professional hardwiring service. The vehicle and the device might be damaged by heat if a T/S cable is hardwired directly to the turn signals under the car bonnet, It is safer to hardwire the cable to the fuse box or to the ETACS.






4. Installation

■ 4-1. Before Installation ■

- ** Before installation, please park the vehicle on a level surface and bright area, Turn off the engine and remove the key. (Be sure parking break is ON)
- * Pick a spot for the device behind or near the rear view mirror not blocking the driver's vision,
- ** Do not install the device with the lens facing upwards, Some functions may not work properly, (Weak GPS signal, continuous event recording)
- * Keep the lens clean for optimal video quality.
- * Make sure the device does not interfere with the driver's vision.
- * Adjust the angle of the camera lens, so that is shows approximately 40% of the car bonnet on the bottom of footage.
 - If the lens is installed excessively facing downwards, traffic signs may be indistinct, If the lens is installed too high, footage may look dark overall due to the bright sky,

■ 4-2. Step-by-Step Installation Guide ■

- Apply double—sided adhesive tape on the fixed—type mount, Slide the device into the mount,
 - ** Check if a microSD card is inserted. The device does not start recording without a microSD card.
 - * Make sure Wi-Fi dongle is inserted into the front cam.




- 2 Attach the device behind or near the rear view mirror not blocking the driver's vision, Do the same for the rear cam,
 - X Detaching and reattaching the adhesive tape causes the tape to lose its stickiness.




■ 4-2. Step-by-Step Installation Guide ■


After connecting the front/rear connection cable to the device, run the cable along the windshield headliner all the way to the driver side A-pillar trim. (as sown in the picture colored pink.)



After installation, turn the engine on and select the power option. (ACC or ON)



4 Connect the cable to the rear cam.



- ** The device reboots when the Front/Rear connection cable is connected/disconnected.
- ** The device does not work properly if the Front/Rear connection cable is not firmly connected to the rear cam.
- ※ Disconnecting the Front/Rear connection cable when the device power is ON can damage the device, Turn off the device before disconnecting the cable,
- 6 Using the Qvia App, view the live-stream video to adjust the camera lens, Approximately 40% of the car bonnet should be shown on the bottom of footage,

■ 4-3. How to Hardwire Continuous Power Cable ■




Locate the fuse box and the chart that shows you what each fuse is for. Choose where to hardwire the continuous power cord and the ACC wire.

W Use fuse tongs to easily insert and remove individual fuses.





Identify a fuse (e.g. cigar lighter, audio etc.) to connect with the red ACC wire and insert it back to the fuse box.

- ** Location of ACC power supply may differ depending on the vehicle
- ※ Please connect the ACC wire to the output terminal, If wired incorrectly; there is a risk of a fire.





Identify a fuse (e.g. emergency lamp, indoor lamp etc.) to connect with the yellow B+ wire and insert it back to the fuse box.

- Location of B+ power supply may differ depending on the vehicle.
- ※ Please connect the ACC wire to the output terminal, If wired incorrectly; there is a risk of a fire.



Connect the black GND wire to a grounding source. (e.g. metal component)






If the power cable is improperly hardwired, the device will not function properly.

We recommend using a dual fuse holder as seen in the adiacent photo to make the process easier.

■ 4-4. Check Installation of Continuous Power Cable ■


- ** To check if continuous power cable is correctly hardwired, the device has to be turned off.
- * Check GPS LED light to see if continuous power cable is correctly hardwired.
- ** The GND wire (black) must be connected to a grounding source (e.g. metal component) in order to check correct hardwiring.
- * There might be leakage current less than 1mA as LED operates.



Examining GPS LED lights (red, blue, purple) can determine if Continuous Power Cable is hardwired correctly.

■ 4-5. Memory Card Recording Time ■

- Video is recorded at 3-minute interval for continuous recording, 30-second interval for motion and event recording,
- Below table is based the microSD card setting which is set to the following proportional storage assignment for each recording mode: continuous 70%, motion detection 20%, event/emergency 10%.

- ** The table above is based on Front Cam 6MB/sec, and Rear Cam 7M/sec. Also, the writing speed of a microSD card can change the total number of files that can be saved onto the memory card.
- ** The table above is an approximation, There may be some variation with actual recording time and the number of files that can be saved onto a microSD card depending on user settings.
- * 'Total Recording Time' is calculated considering a set of front and rear videos as one (Front and Rear video files are saved separately).
- * In Parking Mode Recording, Motion Detection and Time Lapse Recording cannot be used at the same time (You can choose either one option in settings).

5. Device Operations

■ 5-1. Basic Operations ■

1, How to Start and Stop Recording

You can easily set 'Power Safety Function' by manipulating the power switch on the device.



 ON: Supports recording during driving/parking (In Parking Mode Recording, the device records during pre-set voltage or time before shutdown)

** After the device has successfully started, it will start recording after the voice message "drive safely."

- ACC: Supports recording during driving (the device operates while the engine is on and stops operating when the engine is off)

- OFF: Power not supplied to the device

* Check if a microSD card is inserted into the device before turning it on,

3, Video Playback

- Check real-time video: APP When you touch 'Qvia View' icon on the Qvia App and select Front or Rear icon on the top right corner, you can check video being recorded (When Wi-Fi is connected).
- Check recorded video: APP When you touch 'Qvia View' icon on the Qvia App and select a video from the list, you can watch the selected video.
 PC You can play back recorded videos using Qvia Viewer or other media players by inserting the microSD card to a PC (Use a microSD card adapter).

8. Recording During Driving

- Continuous Recording: Continuously records and saves 3-minute videos in AlwaysMovie folder. 'Always' is displayed on the bottom of footage.
- Event Recording: Records and saves a 30-second video in EventMovie folder when impact is detected (10 seconds prior and 20 seconds after impact)
- Emergency Recording: Records and saves a 30-second video in EventMovie folder upon pressing the emergency button for one second. (10 seconds prior and 20 seconds after impact)
 - * Emergency recording does not operate during Event recording and vise versa.

9. Recording During Parking

- Parking Mode is activated when the power switch is at ON.
 - ** Note that the recording stops and the device turns off when the vehicle's battery drops below a pre-set voltage level,
- How to Switch to Parking Mode: You can set time for 'Auto-Conversion to Parking Mode' option. With this option enabled, the device will switch to
 Parking Mode after a pre-set time when the car ignition is turned off.

- When Motion Detection Recording is enabled in user settings, a 30-second video is recorded and saved in MotionMovie folder (10 seconds prior and 20 seconds after motion is detected)
 - * Settings for Motion Detection Recording can be changed on Qvia Viewer or the Qvia App. (Settings) Additional)
 - ** Motion Detection Recording only records when motion is detected. When motion is detected red Security LED light will blink fast,
 - * Motion detection may fail when the surrounding of the vehicle is too dark,
 - ** The total recording time of Parking Mode Recording may vary depending the vehicle's battery status.
 - * Depending on the user's parking environment, motion may not be detected or there might be frame rate drop.
 - ** Motion can constantly be detected according to changes in the surrounding of the vehicle. The level of motion detection sensitivity must be set in accordance with the user's parking environment.
 - (e.g. If the vehicle is parked on a street or an underground parking lot, frequent movements may interfere with Motion Detection Recording.)
- When Time Lapse Recording is enabled in user settings, 30-second videos are recorded and saved in MotionMovie folder. Time Lapse Recording captures at one frame per second when the vehicle is parked.
 - Each file is 30 seconds but spans about 7 minutes 30 seconds.
 - Event/Motion Detection Recording does not operate if Time Lapse Recording is enabled.

10, Driving Information

Qvia Dash Cam can save up to 2 million driving information data onto the microSD card. After you set the time interval for saving the driving information
in settings, the device will automatically save the data on a regular basis.

11. ADAS (Advanced Driver Assistance System)

- LDWS (Lane Departure Warning System)
 - ** Auto Calibration is complete in about 2~4 minutes when driving at a speed greater than 30km/h, The ADAS LED light will turn on in blue.
 - ** Based on the real-time video, an audible warning goes off and the blue LED light blinks fast when the vehicle departs its lane to the left, and it will blink slow when the vehicle departs its lane to the right.
 - Warnings go off in accordance with the speed and sensitivity settings.
 (e.g. If the speed is set at 50km/h in settings, LDWS warnings go off when the vehicle is traveling above 50km/h and departs its lane.)
 - * Depending on the vehicle's speed and the sensitivity setting, ADAS LED and warnings may not function in a consistent manner.
- FCWS (Front Collision Warning System)
 - ** Based on the real-time video, an audible warning goes off and the red LED light blinks fast to avoid possible rear-end collision,
 - Warnings go off in accordance with the speed and sensitivity settings, (e.g. If the speed is set at 30km/h in settings, FCWS warnings go off with red LED light blinks when the vehicle is traveling above 30km/h and detects possible rear—end collision.)
 - * Depending on the vehicle's speed and the sensitivity setting, ADAS LED and warnings may not function in a consistent manner.
- FVSA (Front Vehicle Start Alarm)
 - ** Based on the real-time video, an audible warning goes off and the red LED light blinks slow when the front vehicle starts. The user's vehicle must be at a stop for FVSA to operate.
 - ** When the user's vehicle is at a stop (Driving Speed 0Km/h) and the front vehicle starts, an audible warning goes off in 5 seconds and the red LED light blinks slowly.
 - * When the user's vehicle is at a stop (Driving Speed OKm/h) and if an object is detected in front, an audible warning may go off with red LED light blinks,

12. Night Vision

- When using Night Vision in Parking Mode, the brightness will be enhanced for optimal video quality, especially in low-light conditions.
- User settings can be changed on Qvia Viewer or the Qvia App. (Setting) Video)






